## Morrison misses shot to jump into history

won both the high-jump and

long-jump college championships at the Penn Relays, this celebrated track-and-field carnival wasn't even half as old. It's not likely that Mike Morrison, the bedrock of what is a loaded group of University of Florida sprinters and jumpers,

knew that Irv Mondschein of New York University won both

events in 1947 - and no one else has since. Fifty-eight years and scores of athletic leaps at Franklin Field later, Morrison, the sophomore from Willingboro High, thought he had a chance to make such history yesterday.

But Mondschein — who went on to become a head track coach at Penn — had his bit of history salvaged by a not-so shiny bit of weather.

Morrison was pulled from the high jump and then inserted himself as the second leg in Florida's 4x200-meter relay lineup of Reggie Witherspoon, Morrison, Kyle Farmer and Kerron Clement, a smart move that resulted in a Gators gold in 1 minute, 20.94 seconds. It was a rather redemptive affable head coach Curtis Frye

win for Florida, which had been upset by LSU earlier in the day in the 4x100 championship race. "We didn't get it in the 4x100,

so we really wanted it in the 4x200," said Morrison, who had nabbed gold in the long jump on Friday. Of course, he might have wanted it in the high jump, According to Florida head

coach Mike Holloway, the decision was made to pull Morrison from the high jump when the coach woke up to see a wet and windy Philly forecast. No one wanted to put Morrison's health at risk, especially when he could give a boost to the Gators' sprint-relay chances, even if it was the first time he was part of a winning 4x200.
