WAGERING TERMS

Win: Betting a horse to finish first.

Place: Betting a horse to finish first or second.

Show: Betting a horse to finish first, second or third.

Across the board: Betting an equal amount to win, place and show.

Exacta: A bet on which horses will finish first and second, in order.

Quinella: A bet on which horses finish first and second, regardless of order.

Trifecta: A bet on which horses will finish first, second and third, in order.

Superfecta: A bet on which horses will finish first, second, third and fourth, in order.

Pick Five: Picking the winners of five consecutive races. Tomorrow's Pick Five at Pimlico begins with Race 8.

	Ran the race of his life to chase and eventually run down Midnight Hawk in the Illinois Derby. He got a 102 Beyer in that race after taking five races to break his maiden and never getting higher than an 88. Looks like a bounce candidate.	Was a non-factor 11th in the Derby when far back off the early pace and in an uncomfortable circumstance. His good races were all when he was close to the pace so he just adds more speed to a race filled with early heat.	Kentucky Derby winner has been dominant in five consecutive races, winning by a combined 26 lengths and running away from every field at the top of the stretch. This could be more interesting as there is a lot of quality speed in the starting gate, but maybe CC is just too good.	Won Tampa Bay Derby when loose on an easy lead. That scenario will not happen here and none of his other races is close to good enough to win the Preakness.	Has flashed significant early speed in all four of his races. Finished first in the Derby Trial, but was disqualified and placed second. Colt does not have the look of a classic distance horse. Be especially difficult with so many other fast horses in this race.	Fluke Breeders' Cup winner on DQ, mismanaged filly is on her fourth trainer after just eight races. Never close in the Kentucky Oaks and her best Beyer figure is just an 85. Doing her a disservice by running in this spot.	Claimed for \$50,000 in November, this colt's two rallies to win a pair of Maryland stakes have been amazing. Closed both times behind very slow paces and should get a very hot pace this time. KC will have to run an improved speed figure to win, but could certainly hit the board at a big price.	Got the highest 3-year-old Beyer figure (111) when blowing away Honor Code in a Gulfstream Park allowance. Lightly raced colt ran a brilliant race when third in the Wood Memorial, battling through hot fractions and taking a clear in the stretch before tiring late. Be very dangerous if he can clear the field early.	Set the pace in the Blue Grass on a surface that does not favor speed. Colt is another fast one in a race with a ton of speed, but may not be able to keep up with this group.	Did not have a good rail trip in the Derby under Calvin Borel when he lost momentum at a crucial point in the race and then came very wide. Finished seventh in Derby, but ran better than that. With a hot pace and a better trip, this colt could definitely hit the board.
