The players who excelled during the winter season as students and athletes were selected by the Philadelphia Area Sports Information Directors Association.



Performer of the Year

Penn junior **Brendan McHugh** enjoyed a solid campaign by winning the 100-yard breaststroke at the Ivy League Championships in 53.66 seconds, setting a conference, meet, and school record. He was second in the same meet in the 200 breaststroke in 1 minute, 56.77 seconds for a school record and second in the 200 individual medley in 1:47.22. He also was a member of the 200 and 400 medley relay teams that were second and set school records at the same meet. A two-time member of The Inquirer academic all-area team, McHugh is the holder of nine school records. He has a 3.50 grade point average in classical studies and science and technology. He is the second straight member of Penn's swimming team to win this honor after James Fee won it last year.

Performer of the Year

Sophomore **Kelsey Lake** helped Widener capture its first team title at the MAC Championships since 1994 with a number of outstanding efforts at the conference championship. She was the individual champion in both the 200-yard freestyle as well as the 500 freestyle and was a part of a winning relay team in the 400 freestyle relay. Widener also finished second in the 200 and 400 medley relays, and Lake was the individual runner-up in the 200-yard backstroke. During the season, she notched six first-place finishes, including three each in the 200 freestyle and 200 backstroke. She was also named the MAC Swimmer of the Week on Dec. 6 and was a part of three winning relays at the Rowan Cup.

Penn senior **Danielle Kamis**, a four-time NCAA championship qualifier, compiled a 55-11 record in dual matches during the 2010-11 season, earning second-team all-Ivy honors. As a team captain, she helped her team to an overall team victory at the 2011 U.S. Weapon Squad Championships fighting in saber and defeated the 2010 NCAA runner-up and 2009 NCAA champion Becca Ward at the Philadelphia Invitational. For her career, Kamis finished with a record of 180-39 (.822).

Players of the Year

Swarthmore College senior **Kathryn Stockbower**, co-player of the year, is a player of the year for the second time, having been selected in 2009-10. A four-time all-conference player, Stockbower led the Centennial Conference in rebounding average (12.4) and was the Garnet's leading scorer, averaging 14.8 points per game. The senior forward holds the all-time NCAA Division III record with 83 double-doubles and was an honorable-mention selection to the WBCA/State Farm Division III all-American team this season. Stockbower finished her career as Swarthmore's all-time rebounds leader (1,335) and its third-leading scorer (1,677). A 2011 Capital One academic all-District 2 first-team selection, Stockbower was most recently named to the 2010-11 Capital One academic all-American first team (College Division).



University of the Sciences senior guard **Melissa Rotz**, co-player of the year, was named to the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference winter academic team three times and, along with Stockbower, is one of just four women's basketball players to be named to The Inquirer's all-academic team three times. Rotz is also a two-time ESPN The Magazine academic all-District 2 team selection and a two-time Division II Athletic Director's Association academic achievement award winner. Rotz helped lead the Devils to a 21-6 season in 2010-11, ranking eighth in the CACC, averaging 3.4 assists per game and was second in the conference with a 1.6 assist-turnover ratio. She finished her career ranked 11th on the Devils all-time assist list with 273.

Player of the Year

Cheyney University senior guard **Sharif Bray** led the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in scoring and was 13th nationally with an average of 21.3 points per game. Bray also led the league and was 13th in the nation in free-throw percentage at 89.3 percent. He was a first-team all-PSAC East selection and named to both the Daktronics and the NABC all-region team. He was a 2011 Capital One first-team academic all-American in the college division and was named a 2010 PSAC and Association of Athletic Directors Division II scholar athlete award winner. This is the second straight season Bray has made an appearance on The Inquirer Academic All-Star team.
