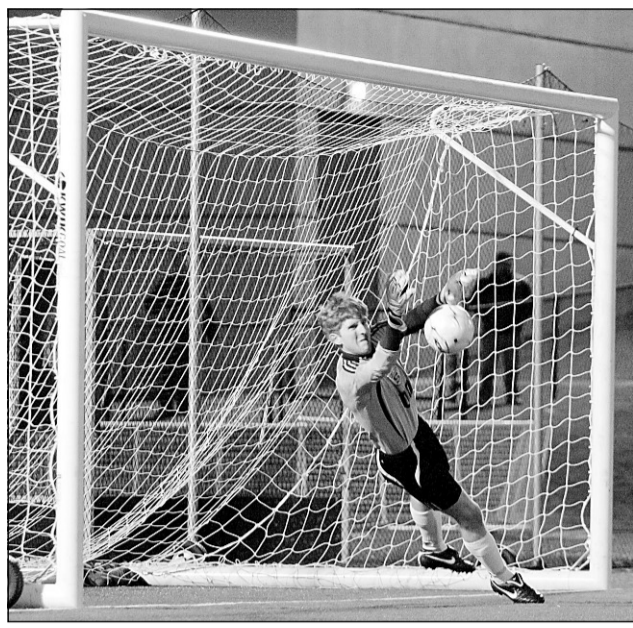

These players, who excel both as students and athletes, were selected as the top players by the Philadelphia Area Sports Information Directors Association.



Player of the Year

Swarthmore goalie **David D'Annunzio** made 66 saves while allowing just 11 goals in posting a 0.51 goals against average. The Piedmont, Calif., native started all 21 games for Swarthmore, helping his team to a 16-1-4 overall mark and a Centennial Conference championship. The Garnet, ranked ninth nationally, ended their season with a scoreless tie with Medaille in the NCAA tournament, with the Mavericks advancing to the Division III Sweet 16 via penalty kicks. D'Annunzio, who ranks second on the all-time Swarthmore list with 31 shutouts, made six stops in the match and turned back two shots in the shoot-out. A junior engineering major with a 3.91 cumulative grade point average, D'Annunzio is a two-time Academic All-Star honoree and a two-time member of the Centennial Conference honor roll.

Player of the Year

West Chester University defender **Jessica Bennett**, a 2010 Daktronics Inc. all-Atlantic Region second-team honoree, is a two-year team captain who was named the school's 2009-10 female scholar-athlete of the year. Selected to the 2010 all-PSAC East first team, Bennett tallied six goals and three assists in leading the Golden Rams to their second-straight PSAC Championship this season.

The senior, who boasts a 4.0 cumulative grade point average as an elementary education major, was named to the 2010 College Sports Information Directors of America/ESPN The Magazine Women's Soccer Academic all-America first team.

Player of the Year

Villanova quarterback **Chris Whitney** is the focal point of a Wildcats offense that ranked among the most efficient passing teams in the nation. In 11 regular-season games, Whitney completed 158 of 245 passes (64.5 percent) with 17 touchdowns and only five interceptions. He threw for 1,818 yards while posting a 145.64 efficiency rating that ranked second in the Colonial Athletic Association. Whitney was also the second-leading rusher for Villanova and carried the ball for 502 yards and a team-high 10 rushing touchdowns.

Academically, Whitney has a 3.44 GPA as a senior accounting major. This is his third straight selection as an Academic All-Star. He is also a two-time CAA all-Academic team honoree.

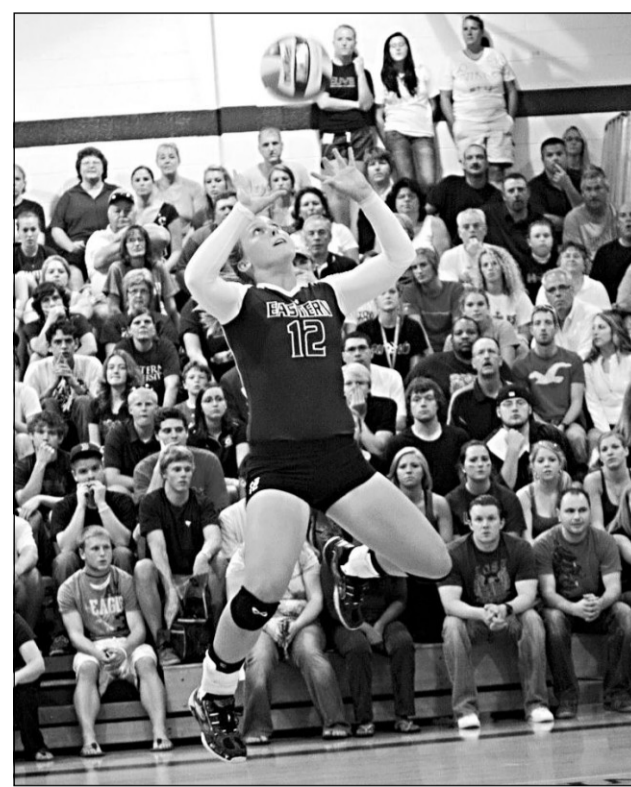
Player of the Year

Drexel forward **Christina Mastropaolo** ranked fourth in the Colonial Athletic Association with 37 points in games played through Nov. 8. She was also tied for fourth with 14 goals and tied for sixth with nine assists. Mastropaolo earned NFCA all-America second-team distinction and was named the CAA player of the year in 2009. The senior is the program's all-time leader with five single-game goals, 10 single-game points, 29 single-season goals, 69 single-season points, 59 career goals and 140 career points.

Eastern University's **Maria Horning** recently earned AVCA Division III first team all-America honors and had previously earned two third-team all-America honors. She led her team to a 30-5 record in 2010 and an appearance in the NCAA Division III regional semifinals. She recently earned the title of Freedom Conference player of the year for the third time and ranked in the top five nationally in assists per set. The Denver, Pa., native has a 4.0 grade point average as sophomore economic development major. Horning led Eastern to two straight Sweet 16 appearances in the NCAA Division III championships prior to this season and has helped lead the Eagles to a 97-12 mark over the last three seasons.

Runner of the Year

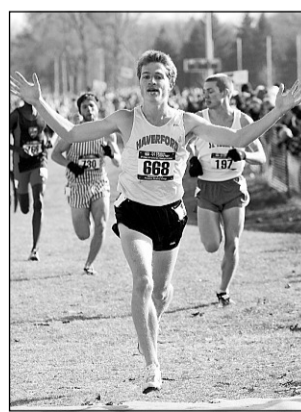
In addition to leading the Wildcats to their second straight national championship, Villanova's **Sheila Reid** became the eighth individual national champion in school history by winning the meet with a time of 20 minutes, 7 seconds at Indiana State University on Nov. 22. For her efforts, Reid was named the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association women's cross-country national athlete of the year. The senior is also a two-time all-America and three-time all-mid-Atlantic region and Big East performer. She carries a 3.26 GPA as an English major.

Runner of the Year

After winning the Centennial Conference Championship Meet with a time of 24 minutes, 35 seconds, **Andres Hulleburg** of Haverford College continued to lead the Fords on their postseason run. Haverford College claimed a NCAA Division III mid-east regional championship en route to claiming a NCAA Division III national championship at Wartburg College on Nov. 20. Once again, Hulleburg was the Fords' top performer with a first-place finish in a time of 24:22.20. Including Hulleburg, five Fords finished in the top 35, and each earned NCAA all-American status. Hulleburg carries a



3.63 grade point average as a senior sociology major.

He is a five-time Centennial Conference all-Academic selection, earning three fall honors and two spring honors as a member of the Fords' indoor and outdoor track team.
