Dear Mayor Nutter,

Philadelphia is a city that prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, age and mental or physical disability. As the Cradle of Liberty, we need to embody the values of equality, liberty and justice for all. We urge you to reject a sweetheart sale of public property to the Boy Scouts.
