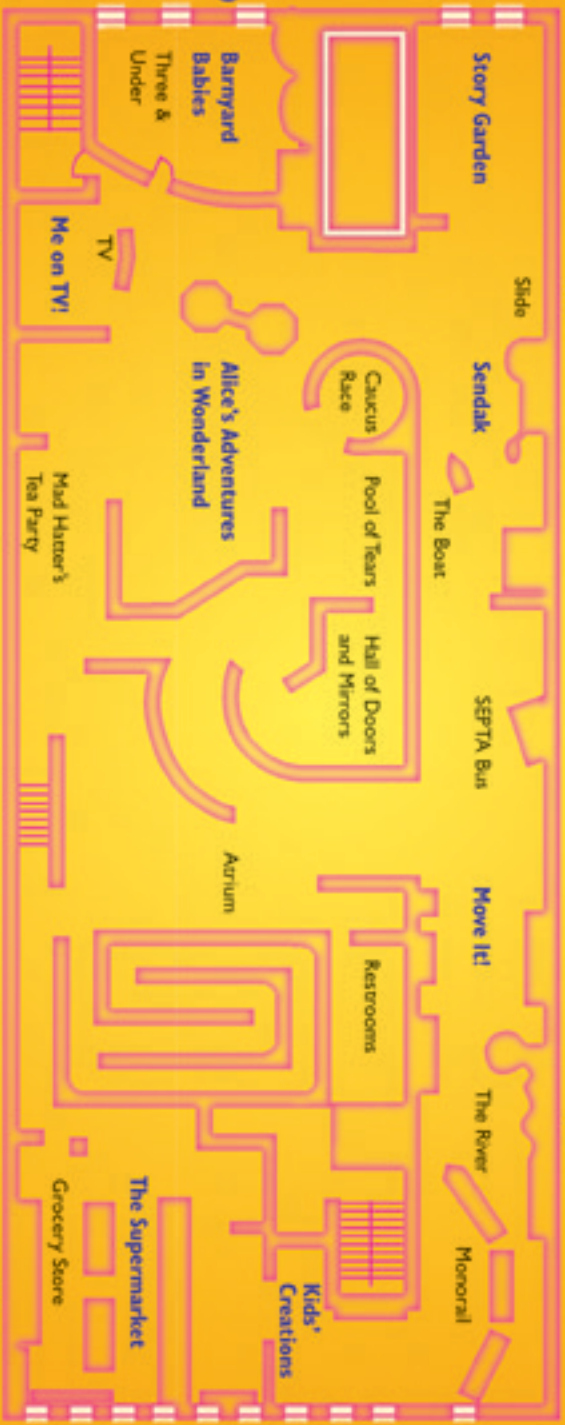


Science Park
