

Commonly considered one of Mexico's greatest composers, Silvestre Revueltas wrote the score to the 1939 film Night of the Mayas about a contemporary Mexican couple who abandon modern society to live in the manner of their Mayan ancestors. Later reworked as a concert suite, the score draws on a variety of musical traditions found in Mexico, including Mayan folk music, and features a large percussion section.
